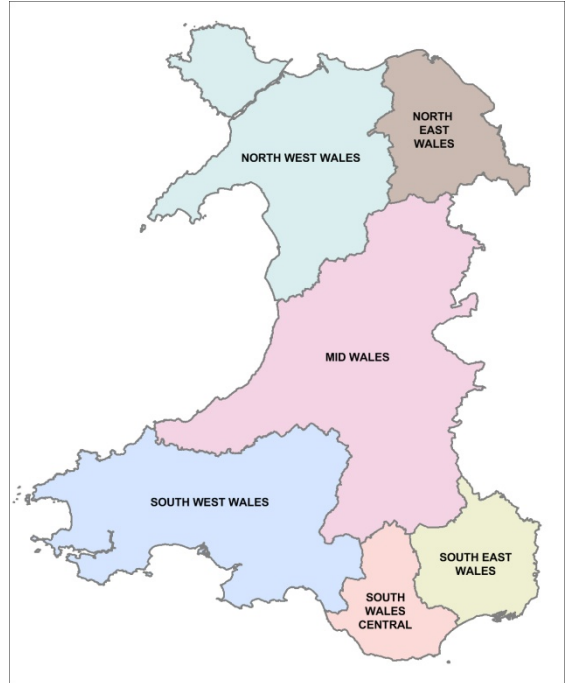

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# 1 Introduction

- 1.1 White Consultants were commissioned by Natural Resources Wales in August 2017 to undertake a LANDMAP Visual and Sensory assessment of the urban areas of Cardiff and Swansea and produce a limited statistical analysis of the revised Visual and Sensory aspect layer divided in Local Authority Groupings. These groupings have been revised since the previous analysis in 2016 comparing 2012 and 2015 data (*LANDMAP Visual and Sensory Aspect Statistics: 2015, White Consultants, 2016*). The format of this report is the same as this previous report for consistency.
- 1.2 Key findings are set out by survey question, supported by graphs and maps as appropriate. Detailed data tables supporting the analysis are set out in **Appendix 1**.
- 1.3 It should be made clear that the overall Wales area referred to in the text is derived from the LANDMAP Visual and Sensory layer which is different from the official Wales area. This is mainly due to the treatment of coastal waters which are included in places in the Visual and Sensory layer. All percentages stated are related to the relevant LANDMAP Visual and Sensory dataset area, not to the official Wales or local authority grouping land area.

## 2 Analysis

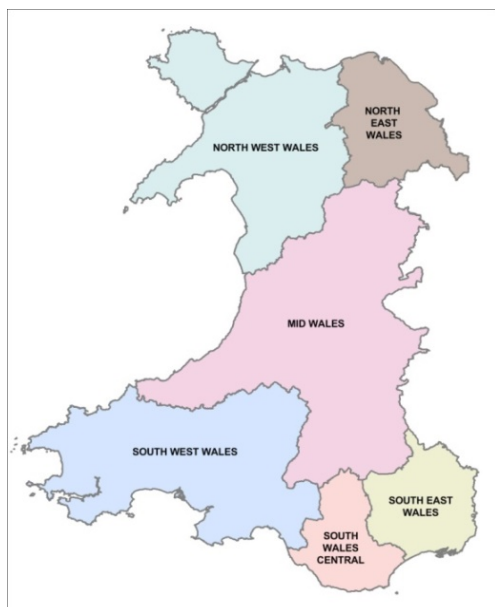


Figure 2.1: LPA groupings

- 2.1 This chapter sets out the analysis of the classification and evaluation of the Visual and Sensory layer for the six revised Local Planning Authority (LPA) groups within Wales. These have new names and the previous Areas 3 and 4 have been amalgamated to form the South West Wales group. The new groupings have been amended to correlate with the NRW place based Area Statements and will facilitate the inclusion of landscape information into the Area Statement integrated evidence base. The LPA groups are now as follows and are shown in Figure 2.1:
- South East Wales- (former Area 1) Monmouthshire, Caerphilly, Blaenau Gwent, Torfaen, Newport
  - South Wales Central- (former Area 2) Cardiff, Vale of Glamorgan, Bridgend, Merthyr Tydfil, Rhondda Cynon Taff
  - South West Wales- (former Area 3) Swansea, NPT and (former Area 4) Pembrokeshire, Pembrokeshire Coast National Park, Carmarthenshire
  - Mid Wales- (former Area 5) Powys, Ceredigion
  - North East Wales- (former Area 6) Wrexham, Denbighshire, Flintshire
  - North West Wales- (former Area 7) Conwy, Gwynedd, Ynys Mon, Snowdonia National Park
- 2.2 There is a difference between the overall areas covered by the LANDMAP Assessment between 2015 and 2016. This is due to the assessment and addition of Cardiff and Swansea urban areas to the assessment- a total of 115km<sup>2</sup> additional developed built and unbuilt land. This is an increase from 4.63% to 5.14% of the total assessed area. This affects the areas of South Wales Central and South West Wales. All other LPA areas and statistics remain the same as for the 2015 report, apart from their names.
- 2.3 The total area of Wales including all areas is now 21,181.9km<sup>2</sup>, an increase of 168.84km<sup>2</sup>. Most is accounted for by the addition of Cardiff and Swansea urban areas but around 47km<sup>2</sup> of this is coastal waters including those off the Vale of Glamorgan. Another issue to bear in mind in the analysis is that land classified as Development/Built Land in Cardiff and Swansea is not evaluated and so the total land areas for Wales, South Wales Central and South West Wales are greater than the areas evaluated.

## South East Wales LPA Group

2.4 The South East Wales LPA group comprises Monmouthshire, Caerphilly, Blaenau Gwent, Torfaen and Newport.

### Classification at Level 1 (Broad landform and land cover) and Level 2 (Landform)

2.5 The largest component within the LPA group is **Upland** (706km<sup>2</sup> or 43%) including 25% of **Hills, Lower Plateau and Scarp Slopes**. The majority of the remaining land in LPA group is **Lowland** (672km<sup>2</sup> or 41%), with just over half of this amount being **Lowland Valleys**. LANDMAP areas classified as **Development** takes up 216km<sup>2</sup> (13%), significantly more than the 5.14% national average. **Water** takes up just 8.53km<sup>2</sup> within the LPA group (0.53%).

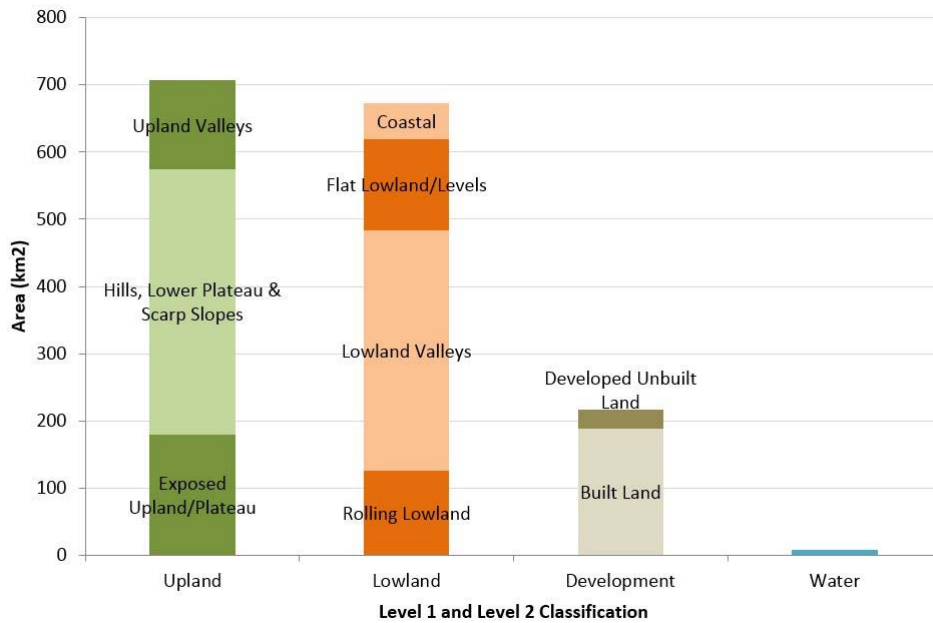


Figure 2.2: Level 1 & 2 Classification (South East Wales LPA Group)

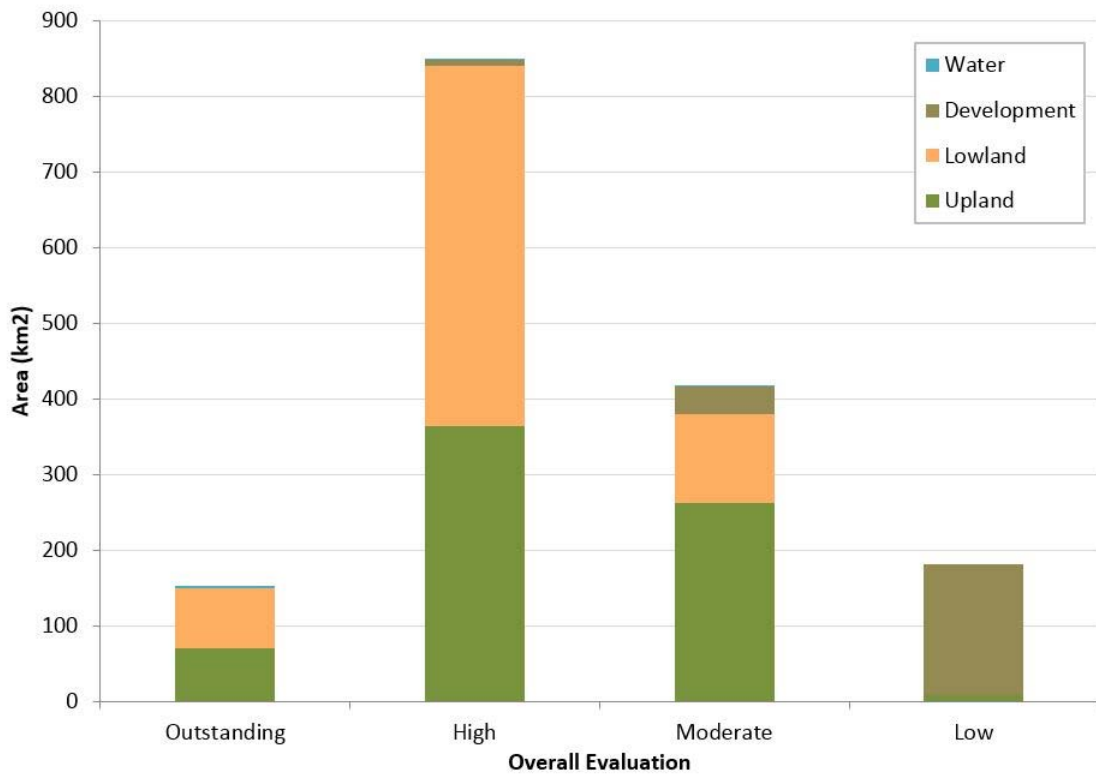


Figure 2.3: Overall evaluation by Level 1 classification (South East Wales LPA Group)

2.6 As shown in Figure 2.3, 10% of LPA group area land (153km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding**. The majority of this land (over 51%) is **Lowland**. The major remaining part is **Upland** (over 46%). Almost half of the land (49% or almost 790km<sup>2</sup>) has an overall evaluation of **High**, the majority is **Lowland** (almost 26%) with the majority of the rest **Upland** (almost 22%).

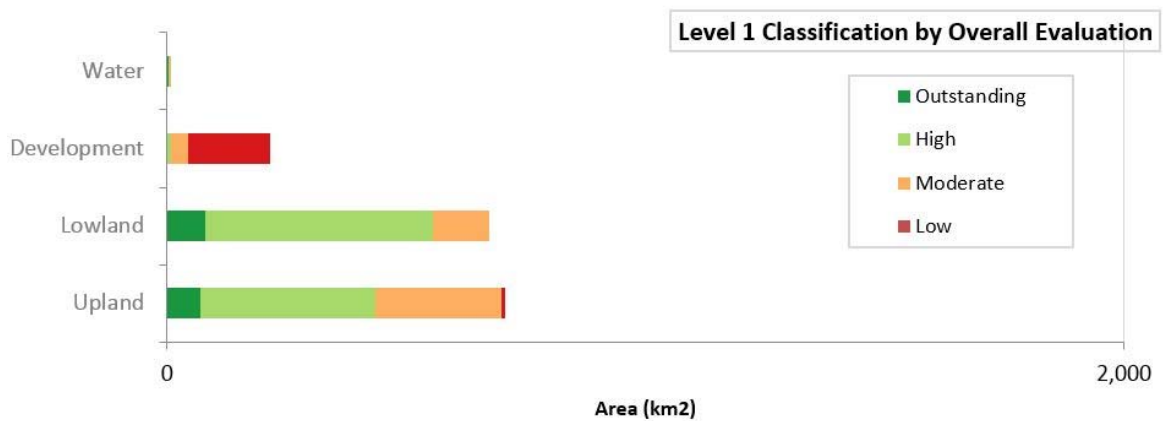


Figure 2.4: Level 1 classification by overall evaluation (South East Wales LPA Group)

2.7 Reviewing the same data by Level 1 classification Figure 2.4, it is apparent that around 35% of the **Lowland** areas within the LPA group area have an overall evaluation of **High** or **Outstanding**. Around 27% of the **Upland** areas within the LPA group area have an overall evaluation of **High** or **Outstanding**.

## Evaluation

- 2.8 There are four questions providing evaluations of intrinsic value of the area, as set out below. These four evaluations contribute to the overall evaluation for each area.

### 46. Scenic quality

- 2.9 Within the LPA group area, just over 9% (145km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of scenic quality with the largest single category being **High** (49% or 791km<sup>2</sup>).

### 47. Integrity

- 2.10 Just over 3% (52km<sup>2</sup>) of LPA group area land is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Integrity. 50% (796km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High**.

### 48. Character

- 2.11 Just under 10% of the LPA group area (9.5% or 152km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Character, and a further 32% (513km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High**.

### 49. Rarity

- 2.12 Within the LPA group area, 13% (212km<sup>2</sup>) of the land is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Rarity, and a further 22% (359km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High**.

## Overall

- 2.13 Overall, slightly more land is classified as **Upland** than **Lowland** but a greater proportion of the latter is classified as **Outstanding or High** value.

## South Wales Central LPA Group

2.14 The South Wales Central LPA Group comprises Cardiff, Vale of Glamorgan, Bridgend, Merthyr Tydfil and Rhondda Cynon Taf.

### Classification at Level 1 (Broad landform and land cover) and Level 2 (Landform)

2.15 Land within the LPA group is almost equally classified as **Lowland** (37.6% or 497km<sup>2</sup>) or as **Upland** (37.3% or 494km<sup>2</sup>). Lowland is primarily **Rolling Lowland** (22%). Upland is primarily **Hills, Lower Plateau and Scarp Slopes** (19%). LANDMAP areas classified as **Development** takes up 280km<sup>2</sup> (21%), significantly more than the 5.14% national average. **Water** accounts for just under 53km<sup>2</sup> which comprises mainly of coastal waters in the Vale of Glamorgan.

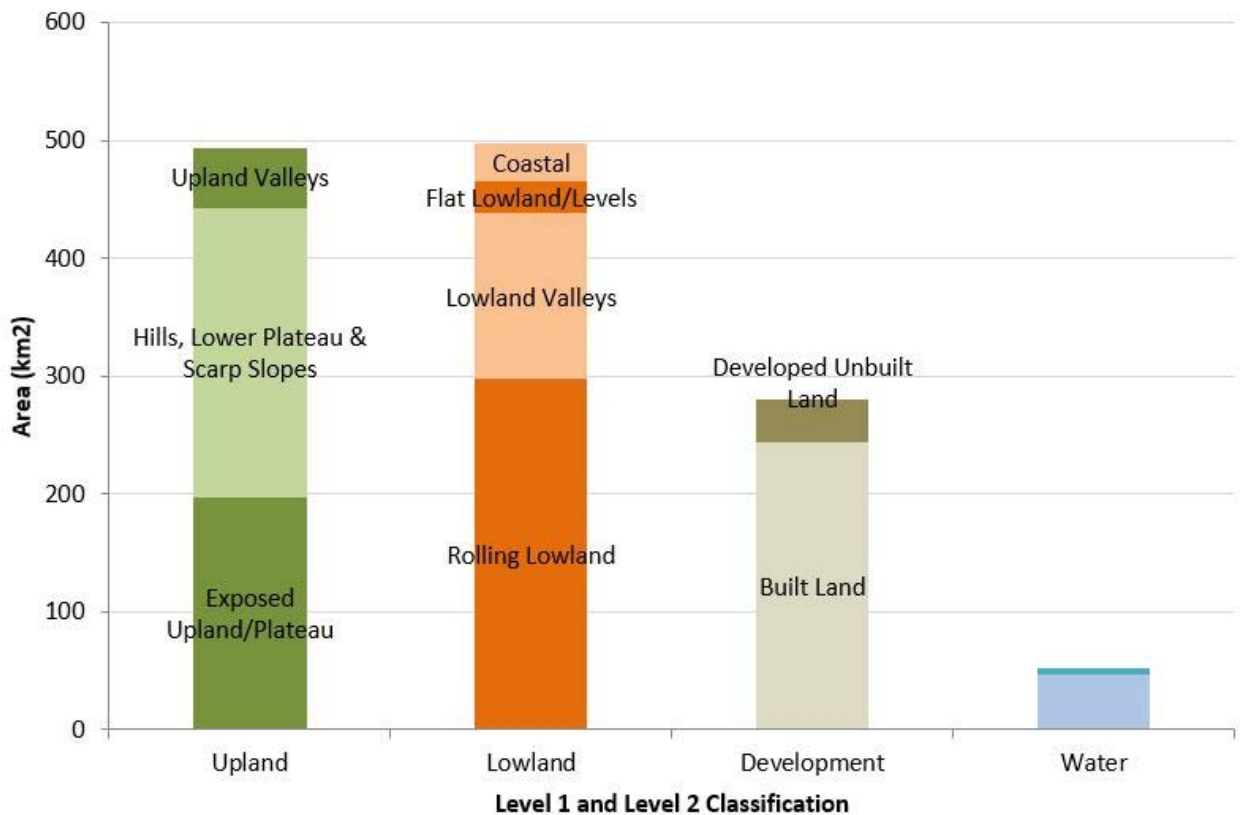


Figure 2.5: Level 1 & 2 Classification (South West Wales LPA Group)

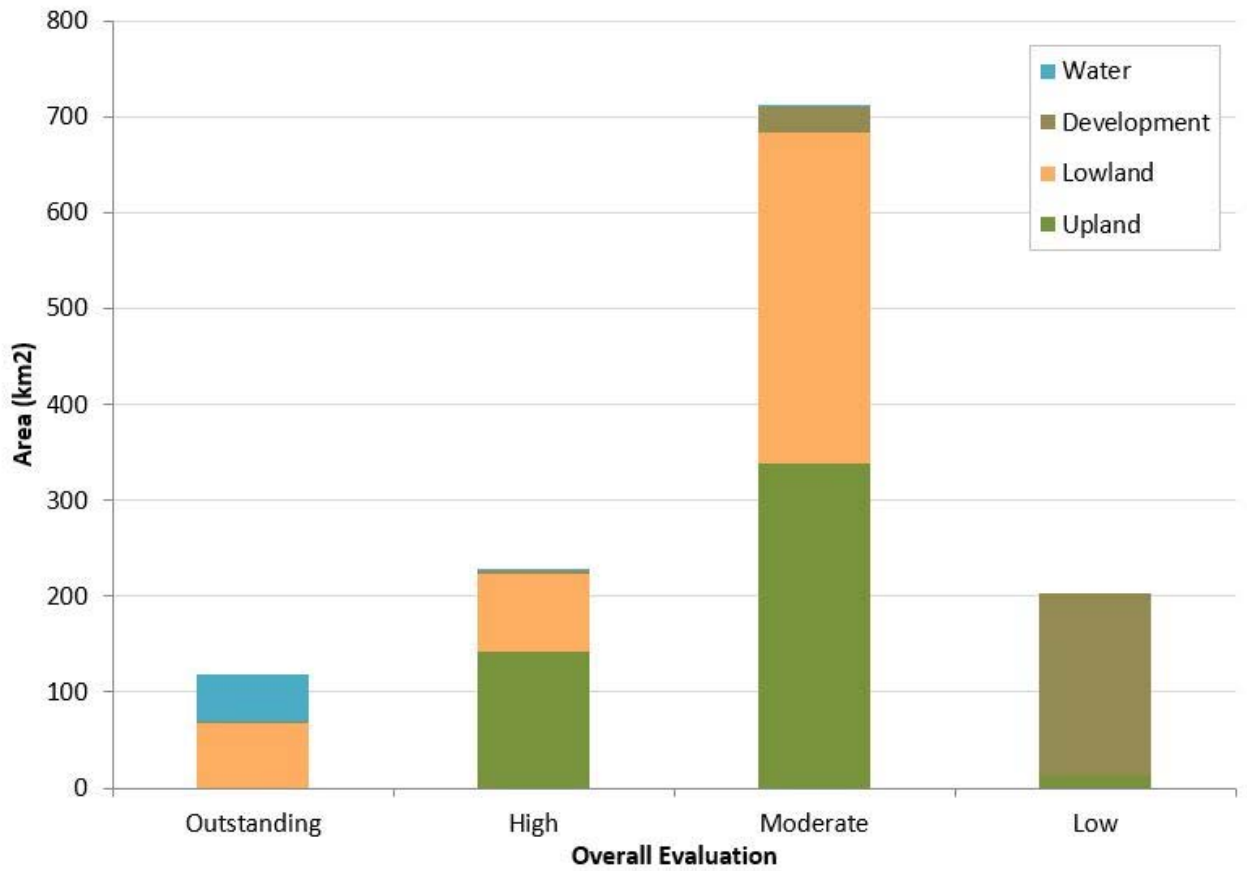


Figure 2.6: Overall evaluation by Level 1 classification (South West Wales LPA Group)

2.16 As shown in Figure 2.6, only 9% of LPA group area land (119km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding**. The majority of this is **Lowland** (57%) with the next highest **Water** (42%). Only 17% or 228km<sup>2</sup> has an overall evaluation of **High**, the majority is **Upland** (63%) with the majority of the rest **Lowland** (36%).

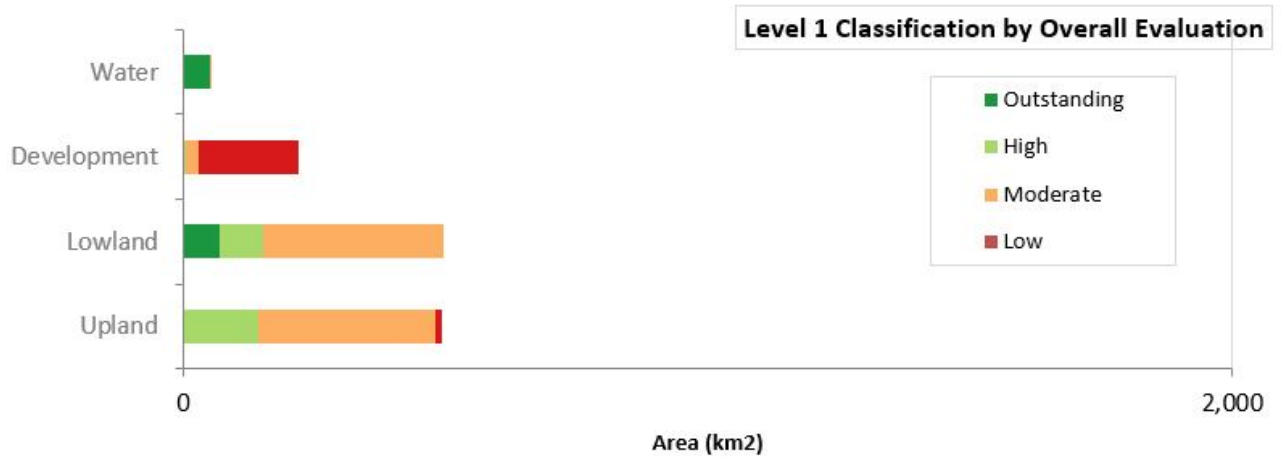


Figure 2.7: Level 1 classification by overall evaluation (South West Wales LPA Group)

2.17 Reviewing the same data by Level 1 classification (Figure 2.7), it is apparent that around 11.5% of the **Lowland** areas and 10.7% of **Upland** areas within the LPA group area have an overall evaluation of **High** or **Outstanding**. The mix is different with more **Outstanding** in the **Lowland** and more **High** in the **Upland**.

### Evaluation

2.18 There are four questions providing evaluations of intrinsic value of the area, as set out below. These four evaluations contribute to the overall evaluation for each area.

#### 46. Scenic quality

2.19 Within the LPA group area, just under 4.7% (57km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of scenic quality with 23% (284km<sup>2</sup>) being high. The majority of the area is **Moderate** (54% or 661km<sup>2</sup>).

#### 47. Integrity

2.20 Just under 1.4% (17km<sup>2</sup>) of the LPA group area land is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Integrity. 17% (202km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated high and 61% (745km<sup>2</sup>) as **Moderate**.

#### 48. Character

2.21 Just under 7% (85km<sup>2</sup>) of the LPA group is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Character, and a further 18% (219km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High**. The majority is **Moderate** (61% or 747km<sup>2</sup>).

#### 49. Rarity

2.22 Within the LPA group area, only 3.5% (42km<sup>2</sup>) of the land is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Rarity, and a further 15.5% (190km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High**.

### Overall

2.23 Overall, a roughly equal amount of land is classified as **Upland** and **Lowland** but a greater proportion of the latter is classified as **Outstanding** value.

## South West Wales LPA Group

2.24 The South West Wales LPA Group comprises Swansea, Neath Port Talbot, Pembrokeshire, Pembrokeshire Coast National Park, Carmarthenshire

### Classification at Level 1 (Broad landform and land cover) and Level 2 (Landform)

2.25 More than half of the land within the LPA group (2,790km<sup>2</sup> or 56%) is **Lowland** with 32% classified as **Rolling Lowland** (or 57% of the total Lowland area). The majority of the remaining land in the LPA group is **Upland** (1,865km<sup>2</sup> or 38%), with around half of this amount being **Hills, Lower Plateau and Scarp Slopes** (20% of total area). LANDMAP areas classified as **Development** take up 242km<sup>2</sup> (4.91%) within the LPA group compared to the national average of 5.14%. **Water** takes up only 44km<sup>2</sup> (0.9%).

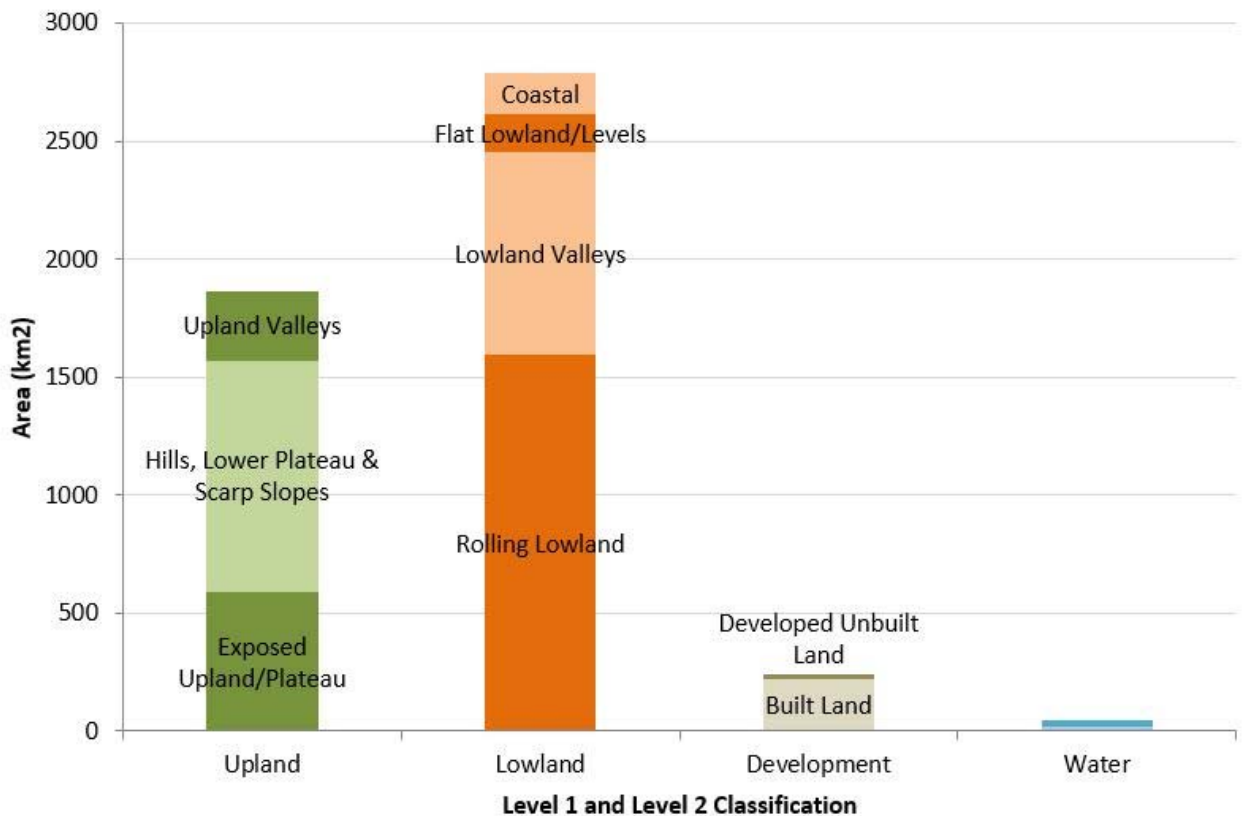


Figure 2.8: Level 1 & 2 Classification (South West Wales LPA Group )

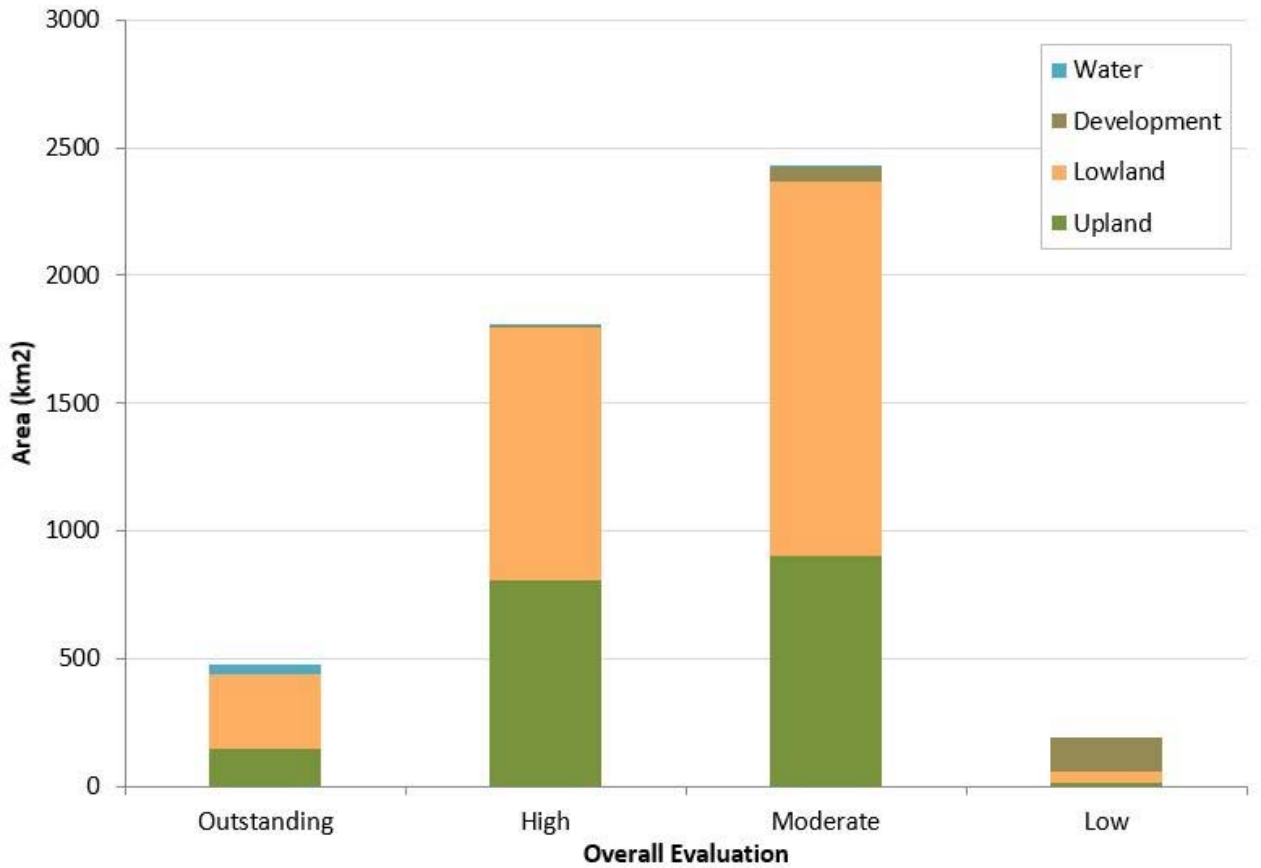


Figure 2.9: Overall evaluation by Level 1 classification (South West Wales LPA Group)

2.26 As shown in Figure 2.9, 10% of the LPA group area land (473km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding**. The majority of this land (60%) is Lowland (mostly **Lowland Valleys**). Interestingly, only 11% of the outstanding area is coastal, given the presence of the Pembrokeshire Coast National Park, but this illustrates the narrowness of the strip associated with coastal qualities. 37% of the LPA group area land (1808km<sup>2</sup>) has an overall evaluation of **High**, over half of this land (55%) is **Lowland**, with the majority of the rest **Upland** (43%).

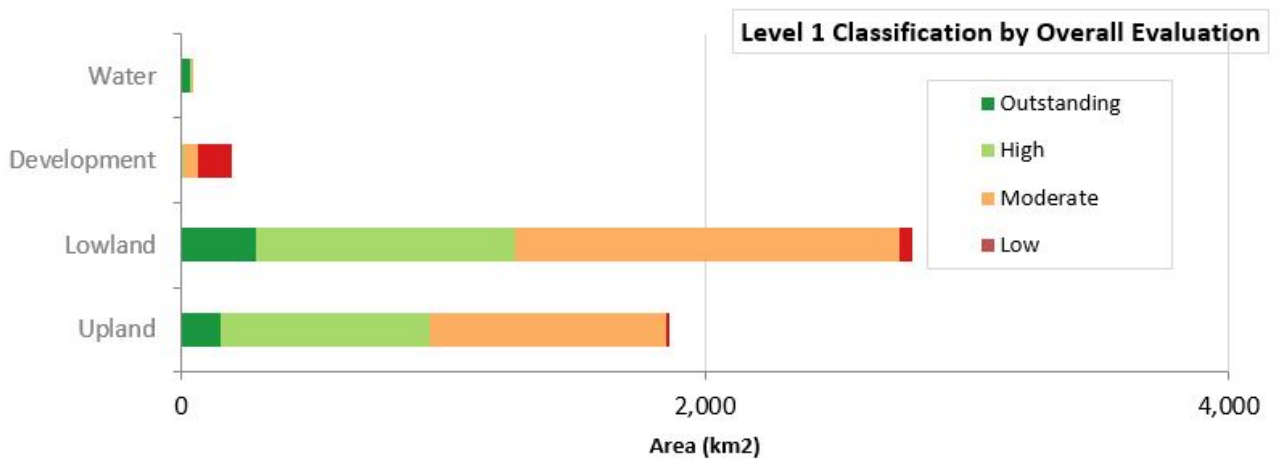


Figure 2.10: Level 1 classification by overall evaluation (South West Wales LPA Group)

2.27 Reviewing the same data by Level 1 classification (Figure 2.10), it is clear that around 26% of the **Lowland** areas within the LPA group area have an overall evaluation of **High** or **Outstanding**. This figure decreases to 19% for **Upland** areas.

## Evaluation

- 2.28 There are four questions providing evaluations of intrinsic value of the area, as set out below. These four evaluations contribute to the overall evaluation for each area.

### 46. Scenic quality

- 2.29 Within the LPA group area, just under 10.5% (509km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding** and 35% as **High** in terms of scenic quality with the majority being **Moderate** (50% or 2441km<sup>2</sup>).

### 47. Integrity

- 2.30 Just over 2.8% (139km<sup>2</sup>) of LPA group area land is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Integrity. 33% (1625km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High**.

### 48. Character

- 2.31 Just 6.7% of the LPA group area (330km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Character, and a further 48% (2325km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High**.

### 49. Rarity

- 2.32 Within the LPA group area, 7% (346km<sup>2</sup>) of the land is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Rarity, and a further 23% (1118km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High**.

## Overall

- 2.33 Overall, more land is classified as Lowland than Upland and a greater proportion of Lowland is classified as Outstanding or High value.

## Mid Wales LPA Group

2.34 The Mid Wales LPA Group comprises Powys and Ceredigion.

### Classification at Level 1 (Broad landform and land cover) and Level 2 (Landform)

2.35 Over three quarters of the land within the LPA group (5675km<sup>2</sup> or 81%) is **Upland** including 41% of **Exposed Upland/Plateau** (or 51% of the total **Upland** area). The majority of the remaining land in LPA group is **Lowland** (1213km<sup>2</sup> or 17%), with just under half of this amount being **Rolling Lowland**. LANDMAP areas classified as **Development** take up only 59km<sup>2</sup> within the LPA group (0.8%) compared to the 5.14% national average. **Water** takes up just 30km<sup>2</sup> (0.4%).

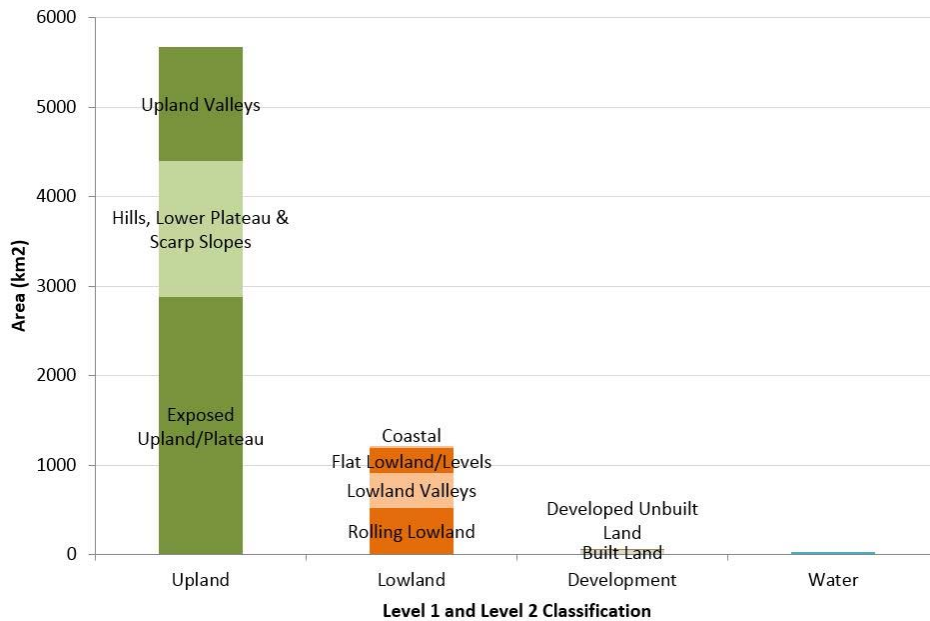


Figure 2.11: Level 1 & 2 Classification (Mid Wales LPA Group)

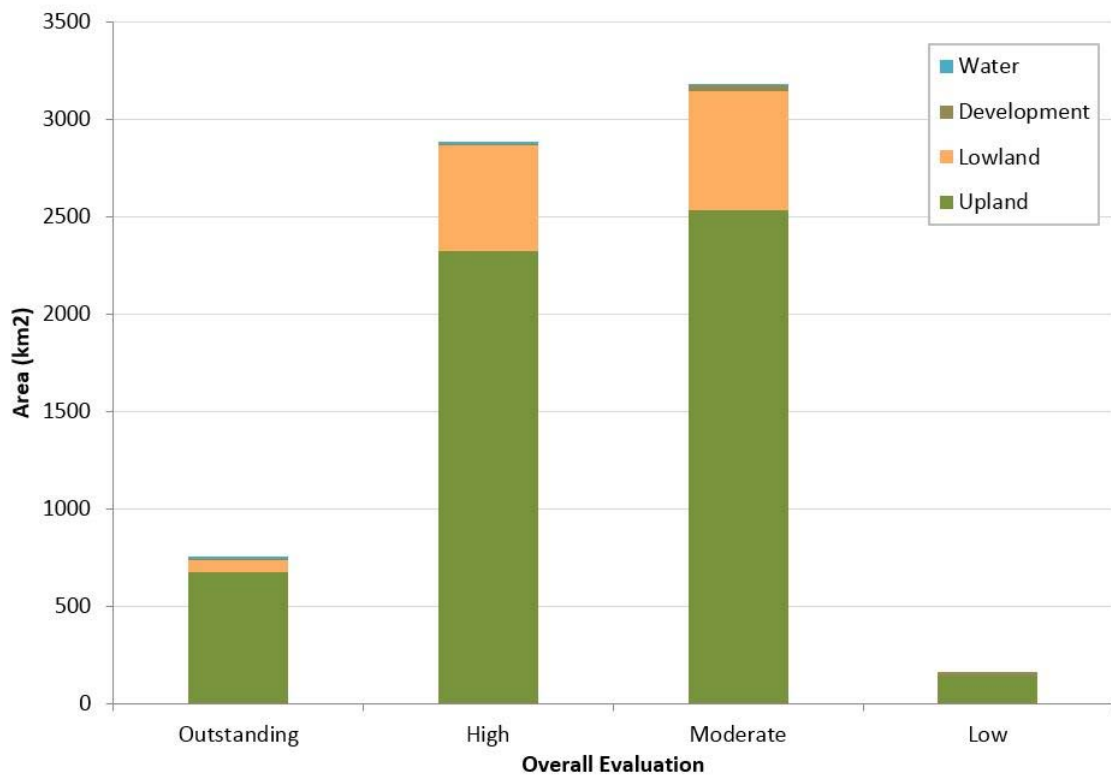


Figure 2.12: Overall evaluation by Level 1 classification (Mid Wales LPA Group)

2.36 As shown in Figure 2.12, 11% of LPA group area land (758km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding**. The vast majority of this land (90%) is **Upland**. 41% of LPA group area land (over 2,886km<sup>2</sup>) has an overall evaluation of **High**, the majority of this land (80%) is **Upland**, with the majority of the rest **Lowland** (almost 19%).

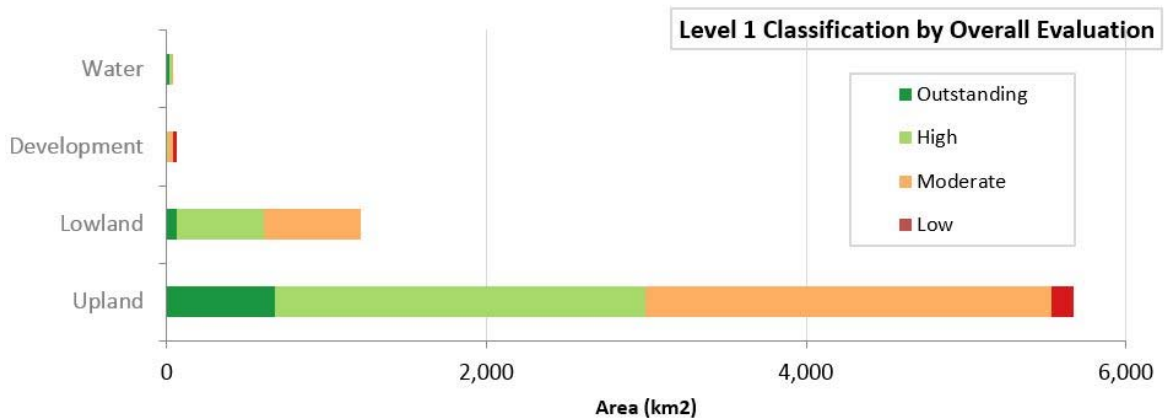


Figure 2.13: Level 1 classification by overall evaluation (Mid Wales LPA Group)

2.37 Reviewing the same data by Level 1 classification Figure 2.13, it is apparent that over 43% of the Upland areas within the LPA group area have an overall evaluation of High or Outstanding compared to only 9% classified as Lowland.

## Evaluation

- 2.38 There are four questions providing evaluations of intrinsic value of the area, as set out below. These four evaluations contribute to the overall evaluation for each area.

### 46. Scenic quality

- 2.39 Within the LPA group area, just over 15% (1055 km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of scenic quality with just over 41% or 2875km<sup>2</sup> being **High** in just under 41% or 2838 km<sup>2</sup> being **Moderate**.

### 47. Integrity

- 2.40 Just under 6% (412km<sup>2</sup>) of LPA group area land is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Integrity. 48% (3372km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High**.

### 48. Character

- 2.41 Over 14% of the LPA group area (1006km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Character, and a further 44% (3085 km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High**.

### 49. Rarity

- 2.42 Within the LPA group area, only 3% (221km<sup>2</sup>) of the land is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Rarity, a further 32% (2218 km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High**, with the majority of almost 54% being **Moderate** (3765 km<sup>2</sup>).

## Overall

- 2.43 Overall, significantly more land is classified as **Upland** than **Lowland** and this also has a significantly greater proportion classified as **Outstanding** or **High** value.

## North East Wales LPA Group

2.44 The North East Wales LPA Group comprises Wrexham, Denbighshire and Flintshire.

### Classification at Level 1 (Broad landform and land cover) and Level 2 (Landform)

2.45 Land classified as **Upland** and **Lowland** is fairly equal in this LPA Group. **Lowland** comprises just under 48% (872km<sup>2</sup>), with just under half of this amount being **Rolling Lowland** (46%). **Upland** comprises just under 44% (811km<sup>2</sup>), with over half of this amount being **Hills, Lower Plateau & Scarp Slopes** (58%). The majority of the remaining land in LPA group is LANDMAP areas classified as **Development** taking up 143km<sup>2</sup> (8%) compared to the 5.14% national average. **Water** takes up just 8km<sup>2</sup> (less than 1%).

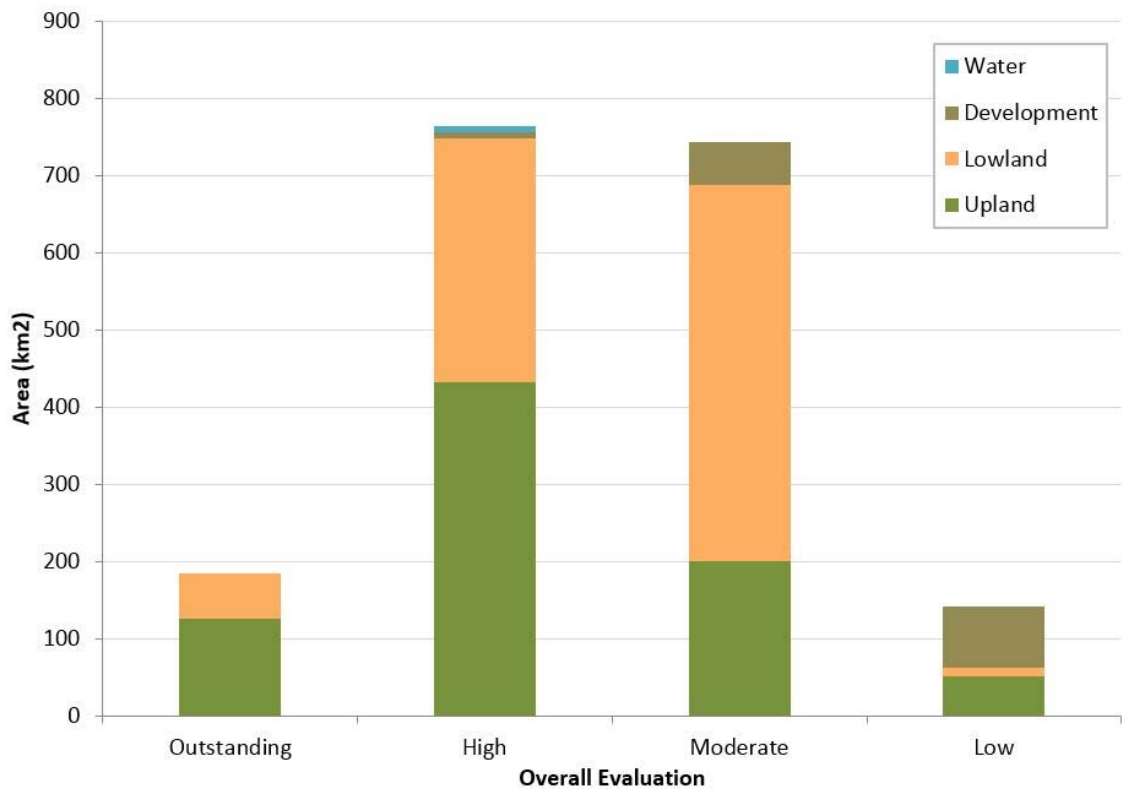


Figure 2.15: Overall evaluation by Level 1 classification (North East Wales LPA Group)

2.46 As shown in Figure 2.15, 10% of LPA group area land (185km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding**. The majority of this land (68%) is **Upland**. 42% of LPA group area land (763km<sup>2</sup>) has an overall evaluation of **High**, the majority of this land (almost 58%) is **Upland**, with the majority of the rest **Lowland** (almost 41%).

2.47 Reviewing the same data by Level 1 classification in Figure 2.16 it is apparent that 68% of the Upland areas within the LPA group area have an overall evaluation of High or Outstanding. The proportion for Lowland is only 43%.

## Evaluation

- 2.48 There are four questions providing evaluations of intrinsic value of the area, as set out below. These four evaluations contribute to the overall evaluation for each area.

### 46. Scenic quality

- 2.49 Within the LPA group area, just under 11% (201km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of scenic quality with the majority being **High** (52% or 960km<sup>2</sup>).

### 47. Integrity

- 2.50 Just under 3% (55km<sup>2</sup>) of LPA group area land is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Integrity. 36% (663km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High** and 47% is evaluated as **Moderate** (863km<sup>2</sup>).

### 48. Character

- 2.51 Just under 16% of the LPA group area (289 km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Character, and a further 36% (661km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High** and 41% is evaluated as **Moderate** (751km<sup>2</sup>).

### 49. Rarity

- 2.52 Within the LPA group area, 12% (224km<sup>2</sup>) of the land is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Rarity, and a further 33% (603km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High**.

## Overall

- 2.53 Overall, slightly more land is classified as **Lowland** than **Upland** but a greater proportion of the latter is classified as **Outstanding or High** value.

## North West Wales LPA Group

2.54 The North West Wales LPA Group comprises Conwy, Gwynedd, Ynys Mon and Snowdonia National Park.

### Classification at Level 1 (Broad landform and land cover) and Level 2 (Landform)

2.55 58% of the land within the LPA group (2611km<sup>2</sup>) is **Upland** including 31% of **Exposed Upland/Plateau** (or 54% of the total **Upland** area). The majority of the remaining land in LPA group is **Lowland** (1671km<sup>2</sup> or 37%), with almost 2/3 of this amount being **Rolling Lowland** (63%). LANDMAP areas classified as **Development** take up 148km<sup>2</sup> (3.3%) within the LPA group compared to the 5.14% national average. **Water** takes up 70km<sup>2</sup> (1.6%).

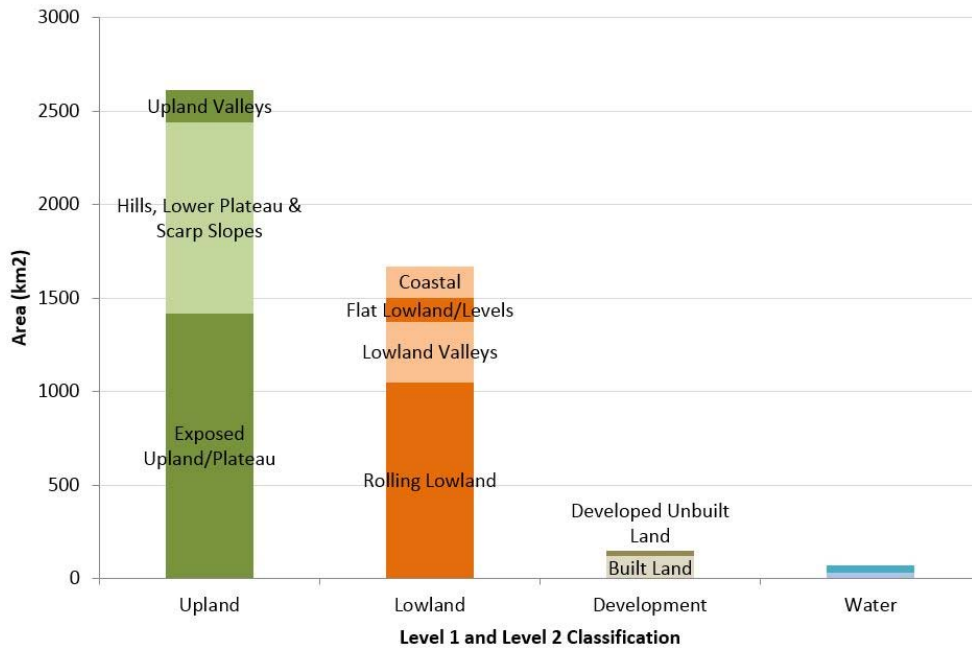


Figure 2.17: Level 1 & 2 Classification (North West Wales LPA Group)

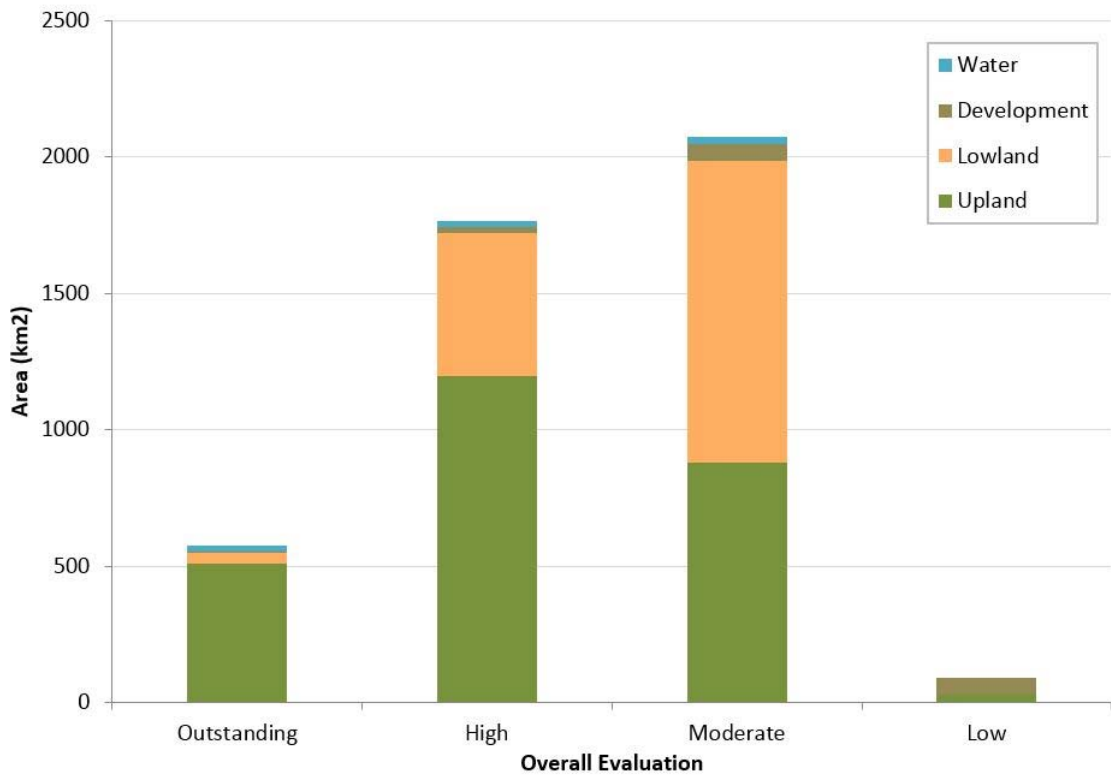


Figure 2.18: Overall evaluation by Level 1 classification (North West Wales LPA Group)

2.56 As shown in Figure 2.18, 13% of LPA group area land (574km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding**. The vast majority of this land (89%) is **Upland**. 39% of LPA group area land (over 1763km<sup>2</sup>) has an overall evaluation of **High**, the majority of this land (almost 68%) is **Upland**, with the majority of the rest **Lowland** (almost 30%).

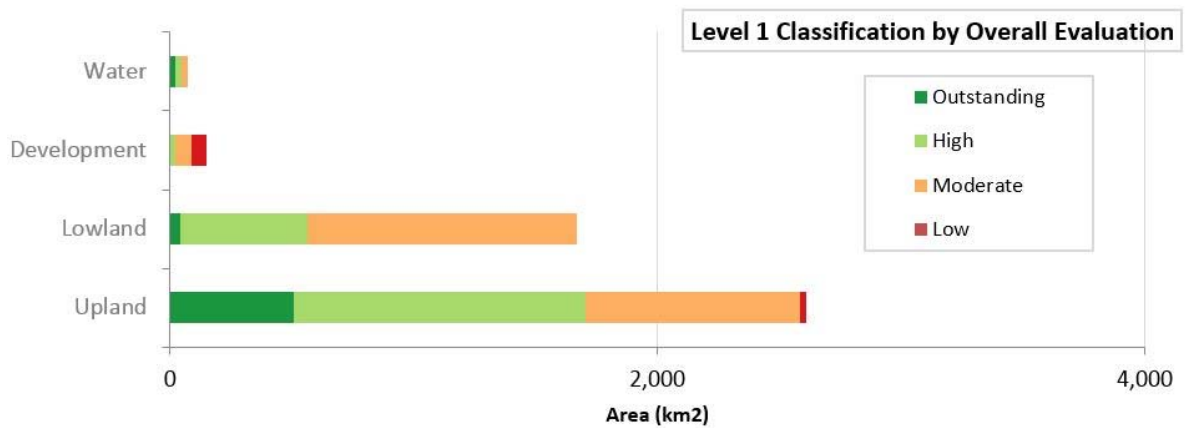


Figure 2.19: Level 1 classification by overall evaluation (North West Wales LPA Group)

2.57 Reviewing the same data by Level 1 classification Figure 2.19 it is apparent that just under 38% of the Upland areas within the LPA group area have an overall evaluation of High or Outstanding. The proportion for Lowland is only 24%.

## Evaluation

- 2.58 There are four questions providing evaluations of intrinsic value of the area, as set out below. These four evaluations contribute to the overall evaluation for each area.

### 46. Scenic quality

- 2.59 Within the LPA group area, just under 14 % (614km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of scenic quality with the largest category being **High** (46% or 2084km<sup>2</sup>).

### 47. Integrity

- 2.60 Just under 2 % (87km<sup>2</sup>) of the LPA group area land is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Integrity. The majority at 57% (2568 km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High**.

### 48. Character

- 2.61 13% of the LPA group area (587km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Character, and a further 48% (2174 km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High**- the largest category.

### 49. Rarity

- 2.62 Within the LPA group area, 6% (263 km<sup>2</sup>) of the land is evaluated as **Outstanding** in terms of Rarity, and a further 36% (1627 km<sup>2</sup>) is evaluated as **High**.

## Overall

- 2.63 Overall, significantly more land is classified as **Upland** than **Lowland** and this also has a significantly greater proportion of land classified as **Outstanding** or **High** value.
